



CLEANING PROCEDURE FOR A.T.V.'s

- 1. Wash down and stow all gear in the Arena and Tractor before washing down the A.T.V. this will allow time for the A.T.V's motor to cool down to a point where it can take cold water without the problems of severe metal contraction causing fractures in the engine components.*
- 2. Take all surf gear out of the rear compartment and front seats.*
- 3. Tilt rear compartment, remove mat, open front bonnet, and remove seats. It is now ready to be washed.*
- 4. Wash the front area of the A.T.V first, that is under the bonnet and front end components, including wheels with fresh clean water ensuring all areas are clean and sand free.*
- 5. Close the bonnet and wash down the exterior front.*
- 6. Move to the front driver area washing the floor, dash board, seats/seat areas with special attention to the area under the seats including the protective bash plate .*
- 7. With the rear compartment tilted exposing the rear suspension and motor wash down the suspension and all other rear components (do not hose inside the muffler) making sure all the sand is washed off including wheels. At this stage the motor will be cool enough to wash down, wash the motor with a soft spray of clean fresh water ensuring the entire motor has been washed adequately. While the rear component is tilted wash it and the rubber mat, leave in the tilted position with the mat on the top of the tray in the boat shed.*
- 8. Inspect the A.T.V. to ensure it is free from all sand and salt residue.*

IMPORTANT: *If at any time the ATV, tractor or 4WD is driven through water or wet sand it is to be immediately cleaned as per the procedure.*

At all times the seat belt must be worn by the driver in any vehicle and passenger (in the ATV), this is law.

Notice to All Users of Ford 4WD

It is not the responsibility of the Mobiles Officer to clean the vehicle after use. It is however the responsibility of the Driver to make every effort to return the vehicle clean and tidy, inside and outside. The vehicle as it stands today is how it was returned after the last user.

Vehicle Requisition Form must be submitted 7 days prior to date required with all details before permission is given for all use and record details in the 4WD Log Book.

Sunshine Coast Regional Council

At all times strictly adhere to the approved activities, location and hours of operation as indicated on the permit.

Not drive or access the dunal area's in any way, only formal beach access ways are to be used.

Do not obstruct beach accesses and public walkways.

In accordance with the Workplace Health and Safety Act 1995: Act in a manner that does not endanger the health or safety of any other person using the land, not wilfully or recklessly interfere with anything provided in the interests of health and safety at the premises.

Drivers must ensure hazard lights are on at all times while driving and the reverse beeper are working. "P" plates displayed as required.

Tractor Safety Hints

Any attempt by a member to carry a passenger on the Tractor or trailer may result in immediate cancellation of that person's license.

When towing trailers and driving on beach area's every care must be taken to ensure public safety, where possible appoint an observer to ensure optimum safety.

When executing a "U" turn on the beach be sure to make the widest possible radius "U" turn as a sharp turn could roll the tyres off the rim.

The diff lock is only to be engaged if the tractor is having problems with traction in soft sand and can only be used when travelling in a straight line.

Tyre pressures are not to be varied, contact the mobiles officer with any issues.

Trailers etc must be attached to the tractor outside the building to ensure no damage to the trailer or building/doors.

When driving the tractor up or down an incline, the driver is to ensure the tractor is driven straight down the incline and no attempt should be made to drive across the incline as it may become unstable and roll.

It is recommended that when roving patrols are conducted in the ATV, a hand held radio is also carried. This is to ensure communications are maintained when the patrol stops for a period of time to observe swimmers etc. The ATV radio switches off when the ignition is off.

At all times when driving the ATV or tractor you must wear your full patrol uniform as required by SLS, this includes the passenger member in the ATV, no person is to ride in the back of the ATV.

The 4wd must be engaged at all times while on the beach and 2wd engaged when off the beach this is to ensure your safety and not damage the vehicles.

Any damage or issues relating to any vehicle/trailer must be immediately reported to the mobiles office.
