The following camps are currently held each year.

## RESUS CAMP

### U13 Age Group

This camp is held over a weekend in November where the U13s stay in the club dorms on the Saturday night. Nippers will obtain their resus certificate whilst spending time with their friends in a variety of activities. This award is a requirement for U13's to be able to compete at Branch and State Titles.

## SRC / BRONZE MEDALLION

### U14 & older

U14 nippers complete this week-long camp held at Dicky Beach Surf Club and obtain their Surf Rescue Certificate, qualifying them to perform patrols. The camp develops a variety of lifesaving skills whilst having fun with their mates. The camp which has run for over 20 years is held on the first weekend of the September school holidays. This award is a requirement for those who wish to compete in U14 & U15 lifesaving carnivals.

## BOARD TRAINING CAMP

### U9 & older learning to paddle a board.

This new camp will run over three mornings on the second week of the school holidays in September. The camp will teach nippers who have never paddled a board or are learning the skills to assist them to become competent, so they can enjoy the surf and catch cracker waves!

## U11 – U13 TRAINING CAMP

As per the title, this training camp in January takes the kids into the bush to rough it for three days, where they will spend time with their mates, training, eating, sleeping, more training and having fun!
